#### Morning Drop-Off

As always, CR Gummow is a busy place in the morning with many students coming and going from our school. It is really important that we have a clear routine and procedure in place Here are some things that you can do to help keep this running smoothly:

- 1. HAVE YOUR CHILD WALK OR TAKE THE BUS WHENEVER POSSIBLE. This helps to keep the number of cars at a minimum and makes everything smoother as a result.
- 2. **NEVER PARK OR PAUSE IN THE FIRE LANE**. This is immediately in front of the main entrance doors and is strictly off limits at all times.
- 3. IF YOU NEED TO GET OUT OF THE CAR, USE THE SIDEWALK BY THE MAIN PARKING AREA, TO THE SOUTH OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING. In this area you can pause your car and get out to walk your child to the yard. There is a sidewalk that lines three sides of the parking lot and that is what indicates a safe area to get out of your car and walk your child to the school yard. Please stay on the sidewalk.
- 4. IF YOUR CHILD CAN GET OUT OF THE CAR INDEPENDENTLY, YOU CAN PAUSE IN FRONT OF THE SCHOOL, ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE SCHOOL BUILDING. In this area, a staff member will be there to greet students and help them get out of the car. While we won't undo seat belts or car seats, we will open car doors and help students with backpacks. Parents CAN NOT get out of cars in this location and must stay in the driver's seat. Please have students in the backseat behind the passenger seat so that they can get out directly onto the sidewalk. Wave at the staff member to get her attention if your child needs help.

Front Door of the school is locked in the morning and we ask that all students walk to the back of the building until 8:20. Please remember that parents are never allowed on our school yard.

#### Going Home from School

Getting 750 students home from school is a big job! There are lots of moving parts to work through for this process! We know that unexpected changes happen sometimes for families, but here are a couple of suggestions for you about students departing from school:

- TRY TO KEEP HOMETIME ARRANGEMENTS CONSISTENT. When possible keep things the same each day so that your child knows what to expect.
- CALL THE OFFICE EARLY IF THERE ARE CHANGES. Sometimes teachers are away sick, or don't check their email as they are busy with students. Always <u>call the office early</u> if there is a change in your routine, to confirm that the message has been received. Also, the sooner we know the better! End of the day is very busy, and you might not be able to get through.
- DON'T RELY ON YOUR CHILD. Lately, we have had a few students receiving text messages indicating to them a change in plans. Please be sure to also notify the teacher or office with this information. We generally need parent confirmation for any changes, particularly below grade 7.
- DON'T PICK UP FROM THE OFFICE AFTER 2:20. End of the day is one of the times the office is busiest. Student pick-ups at this time are challenging for the office. Try and get to school early, or wait until the usual dismissal at 2:40 to pick up your child.
- Due to a severe anaphylaxis allergy to dogs/dog dander; dogs should never accompany families to pick up or drop off

#### Bus Planner App

As a way to have more easily accessible information about bus delays and cancellations, STSCO is using a new app! The app is available for download for both apple and android devices.

- In your phones app store, look for BusPlanner Delays
- Once you've downloaded and opened the app, select Student Transportation Services of Ontario from the drop down menu and click next
- Select "My Child's Bus"
- Select C.R. Gummow from the School drop down menu (for parents with students in multiple schools, you're able to add more than one school at this point)
- After you've selected the school, you can select a route from the drop down menu

#### Student Absence Reporting

In order to report your child's absence you will be using School Messenger. It allows you to report your child's absence quickly and conveniently, in any one of the following three ways:

- By calling 1-844-434-8119 toll-free;
- By logging into the Parent Portal website at studentabsence.kprdsb.ca to set up the ability to report absences online;
- or by downloading the SchoolMessenger mobile app onto your iOS or Android device, to report absences.

You will be able to use whichever of these methods you prefer to report your child's absence, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You will also be able to report future absences at any time.

As an added feature, we are using an automated telephone system to contact parents who have not reported their child absent. School Messenger will continue attempting to reach multiple contact numbers, for a predetermined amount of time. If the automated system has not been able to reach someone in that allotted time frame, our office staff will follow up. By using the toll-free number, website or app to report your child absent before our morning bell time, you will NOT receive a call.

#### Water Bottles

Please send refillable water bottles with your child each day. Our water fountains are still closed, but we have 3 touchless water bottle fillers.

#### School Council - September 22, 6:30

Our first School Council Meeting will be on September 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 in the library. School Council is an excellent opportunity to become involved in the school and learn more about current directions in education.
